

Call: PoSIG Teacher Academy 2022 „Trade Policy in the Age of Populism“

As in previous years with issues like *EU Neighbourhood Policy* or *Populism* we continue with our PoSIG Teacher Academy in 2020 with a highly interesting issue. Of course *Trade Policy in the Age of Populism* may first of all lead to specific pictures from actual politics. But the intention is clearly focused on the relevance of international trade for small countries.

The call is addressed to our partner institutions on Western Balkan, Black Sea Region, Caucasus and Middle East. In these regions several disputes about economic cooperation spaces and the interest of big players is rather present. Therefore the issue is of high relevance and of academic interest. But we also will look at the EU resources in the field of higher education and research we can use for our academic interests as expression of EU Soft Power policy.

Trade Policy in the Age of Populism

How Trade Policy in the Age of Populism is changing the world order for economic cooperation? What explains new regional trade policy initiatives (as Silk Road Economic Belt initiative, Eurasian Economic Union, Trade and Investment Framework Agreements, Free Trade at Balkans Initiatives...)?

- Status of implementation of the various trade policy initiatives.
- Economic and social consequences of these trade policy initiatives (trade effects, distribution of wealth, migration etc.).
- Political consequences of these trade policy initiatives (effects on regimes in the region, regime stability, Chinese influence etc.).

Goals:

- To see whether there is common ground for joint research/research collaboration. Therefore a paper has to be presented.
- To bring participants up to date on research in the field to boost their teaching.
- To identify HE strategies using the Erasmus + and H2020 environment of the next EU budget periode.

We also will prepare inputs about resources of EU Higher Education and research policies supporting activities in this field.

Candidates: Teacher and researcher in Political Science / International Relations working in this field or interested in training in this field.

Nomination: By the sending institution after joint selection of candidates with the hosting partner institution.






